Scripture Reading - Ephesians 4:1-7; 11-13 - The gifts of Christ distributed among us.

Share These Points on Networking:

Networking is an important part of the 21st century and two words stand out when you think of networking - people and social. God made us to be social people and in relationship with others. How do we do that in the 21st century? We network. How do you begin and form networks?

- Ask questions
- Listen
- Find out what makes people tick
- Find out people's interests and gifts
- Find commonalities

Forward Together as Networks will help the synod and congregations create and expand networks and link congregations according to shared passions and challenges.

Theologian Frederick Buechner says that God's work happens at the intersection of our gifts and the world's needs. We can do so much more together than we can do apart.

How can we network in new and different ways? One way is to know what is important to us, what our passions are and what our gifts are in our congregation and then finding others with those same passions and then networking together in ministry.
